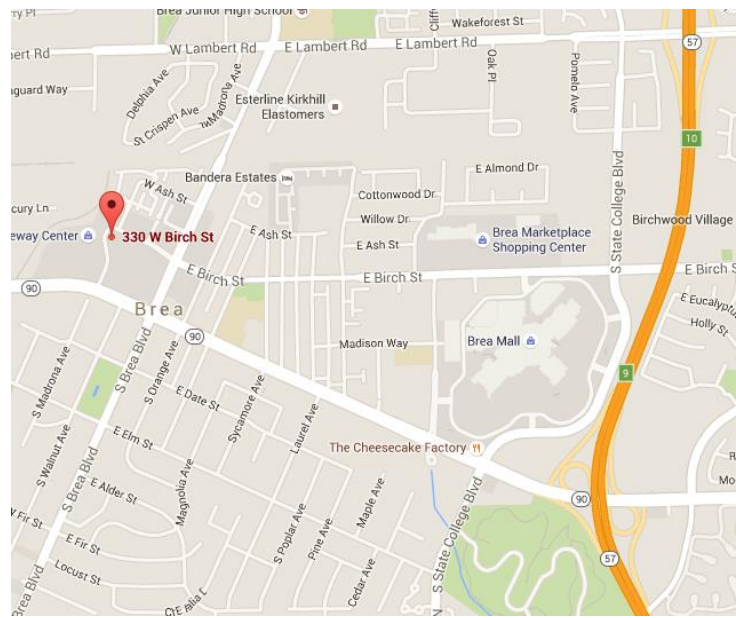
MONTHLY SOCIAL INFO

Rancho Los Alamitos - April 25

OC Vettes will visit Rancho Los Alamitos in Long Beach on Saturday, April 25. Rancho Los Alamitos is a Long Beach City Landmark. The Rancho has a history that stretches back for more than 1,500 years from the early Indians, to the Spanish and Mexican colonists, right up to the Yankee farmers of the mid-twentieth century. The 7½-acre site includes four acres of historic gardens, a ranch house (inhabited 1790-1933), and a restored barnyard of the early 20th-century working ranch. Members will meet at the Rancho (6400 E. Bixby Hills Rd, Long Beach) at 10 AM. It is in a gated community. Tell the guard you are going to the Rancho. Parking is provided. A docent led tour of the Ranch House will begin at 10:30. Public hours for the Rancho are 1 to 5 PM. We will have the property to ourselves as we tour and dine. Lunch will be served at noon. It is a catered lunch consisting of barbecued trip-tip, Caesar salad and sides. Beverages are included. After lunch members are free to see the gardens and walk the grounds for as long as they like. There is a 50 person limit for the event, so the trip will be open to the first 50 people who sign up. The cost for the event is \$40 per person. That includes all costs for the visit including meal, tax, gratuity, service charge and tip for the docent. The final head count is due by Apr 7, so final payment must be paid at the meeting April 7th. Please make note to have checks made out to Janet Cherry. Automotive Driving Museum

This Saturday, March 14 is the trip to the Automotive Driving Museum located in El Segundo. Some different information was given about the place to meet for the trip, and trip organizers Bernie and Nina DeMarkey want to be sure everyone has the correct information. Our group will meet at the Denny's Restaurant, 16907 S, Pioneer Blvd, Artesia, off the 91 Freeway just east of the 605 Freeway. The group will leave Denny's at 9:30 AM. If you'd like to have breakfast at Denny's before leaving, please arrive between 8 and 8:30 AM to make sure you have time order and eat.

The group will head up to the Automotive Driving Museum. Parking is free. Admission is \$15 per person, \$10 per person for seniors. We will tour the museum. The Automobile Driving Museum's mission is to collect, preserve, exhibit and ride in historic vehicles. They currently have over 130 automobiles on display. They use their collection to present educational opportunities and displays that illustrate the aesthetic, engineering and cultural evolution of the automobile.

The museum includes an ice cream parlor where you can get coffee and snacks. Drop in for a scoop, a shake, or a float. Ice cream sandwiches and soda also served there.

If you want something more substantial to eat, El Segundo offers a wide variety of restaurants where members can have lunch on their own after the museum before heading home. Bernie DeMarkey will have a dining guide you can use to find cafes or restaurants that interest you.



Motte Museum Trip

Sue Walker and Janet Cherry are planning a trip to the Motte Museum for Saturday June 13. The museum is located in the Perris Valley. After having coffee and donuts and visiting the museum with its car collection, we will have lunch at the Bombshelter Bar and Restaurant. Then we will head to the SoCal Railway Museum. Mark your calendars for a great trip! The Motte Family is one of the oldest pioneering families in the Perris Valley. In the 1930's three of the Motte sons started farms in the region. Their farms spread over parts of Perris, Romoland, Nuevo, and Lakeview. By 1944 the Motte's were now well established farmers within the valley.

By the 1960's, a decision was made for the family corporation to also become active in real estate and development opportunities. John and Evelyn Motte privately founded the Motte Museum through their estate. Their aspirations were to showcase the history of the pioneer families who first settled in the valley, their antique car collection, and document the area's agricultural roots. The Museum commemorates how the valley has grown and changed to encourage the community to continually preserve and educate others about local history.

Skydive Perris is home to "The Bombshelter" Bar and Restaurant located at the Perris Airport. There you can enjoy a refreshing beverage, get a delicious bite to eat, and listen to live music while watching skydivers in the drop zone.

The SoCal Railway Museum lets you explore the west's largest collection of railway locomotives, passenger and freight cars, streetcars, interurban electric cars, buildings and other artifacts dating from the 1870's so you can experience the early days of electric, steam, and diesel railway transportation in and around Los Angeles. The Perris Car Show will be happening while we are there so you can also check out the great cars. Don't miss out on the fun!
