

Corvette Factory & Race Track Damaged in Tornado from Yahoo.com

By now, most people know that on Saturday Dec 11, tornados ripped through numerous communities in the United States, including Bowling Green, Kentucky where an EF-3 tornado touched down. Unfortunately, both GM's Bowling Green Assembly Plant and the National Corvette Museum Motorsports Park have sustained significant damage. The National Corvette Museum appears to have been only minimally damaged. Meanwhile, countless homes and other business have been absolutely obliterated by the tornado.



Video of what appears to be a fire at Bowling Green Assembly has been circulating on social media. Despite what some might claim, local news station WNKY claims to have validated it, stating a fire did break out in the early morning hours of December 11. Thankfully, a skeleton crew of workers present at the factory when the storm hit are all accounted for and safe.



Damage to the assembly plant where the C8 Corvette is made is still being assessed. In other words, we have no idea if this will slow down production or not, but it looks likely it will. That's not the news anyone waiting for their new Chevy Corvette wants to hear. It's also possible this could push the production launch of the C8 Z06 back.



Aerial footage from News Channel 5 Nashville shows Bowling Green Assembly Plant and the National Corvette Museum as well as NCM Motorsports Park, providing the best view so far of the aftermath. The camera zooms in on a storage building by the track which is missing a roof and two of the four walls, with numerous Corvettes buried in debris both inside and outside the structure.



The National Corvette Museum announced it was closed on Saturday, December 11 and Sunday, December 12. It's unsure how long the closure will be extended. Since the NCM Motorsports Park was heavily damaged in the storm, events like Touring Laps/Experiences, and Run, Run Rudolph 5k have officially been canceled until further notice.

The only view of the damage at NCM Motorsports Park so far comes via Michael Trevor on Facebook, who snapped three photos as he visited. One shows a heavily damaged building and an overturned Chevy Silverado.





Another is of two Torch Red C8 Corvettes buried under some debris which looks to have been peeled off a nearby building. The third is difficult to make out, but it appears to be a parking lot with more debris and cars. Since this came from a car site, they focused on the automotive aspect of the story and not the loss of human life and other storm damage. Still, they stated their hearts went out to all affected by this natural disaster.

The small number of employees that were onsite are all safe," GM said in a statement Sunday.

Owners of enthusiast sites Corvette blogger Keith Cornett talked to Rachel Bugshaw at the factory, She confirmed that the plant will be shut down in the week of December 13. "We can see that the fire that resulted from the tornado activity at the Bowling Green assembly plant early Saturday morning (December 11th) damaged facilities such as the roof and employee entrances," Bugshaw said.

"Maintaining a safe work environment for plant employees is our top priority. Therefore, we are cancelling production on first and second shift the week of December 13 as our trained teams work to get tooling, equipment, and the facility space up to standard."

If you want to help the victims of the tornadoes:

AmeriCares, a health-focused relief and development organization, has sent an emergency response team to Kentucky and has offered assistance to health care facilities in several states. The organization is accepting donations to help fund these efforts.

A **Feeding America** location in Kentucky is raising funds to help provide people with "ready-to-eat bags of food."

The Red Cross has opened shelters and is asking people to make appointments to give blood. Both its national arm and its local chapter in Western Kentucky are collecting donations.

The **Salvation Army** is soliciting donations to help tornado victims in Arkansas, Kentucky and Tennessee.

The **United Way of Kentucky** is asking for donations to provide support services for families in the state affected by the tornadoes.

Vettes for Veterans
