The Lions Automobilia Foundation and Museum was founded in December 2019 by Southern California businessman and car enthusiast, Rick Lorenzen. It's nearly 100,000 sq. ft. facility includes galleries featuring Southern California's infamous car culture and motorsports history. The experience begins as visitors walk in thru a 1960's speed shop with genuine parts hanging off the walls and then enter the Main Street Gallery lined with classics automobiles parked in front of a 1950's diner. The visitor experience has been described as mind-blowing, as each gallery reveals the human experience with the

automobile. Lions is more then just a museum. The Lions Automobilia Foundation takes preserving automotive history to the next level with its onsite restoration facility. As visitors walk through the galleries, they will find that many of the vehicles on display were restored by the Lions Team.

Steven Bronston is hosting this event. We have pre-purchased 25 tickets to get the reduced rate of \$11.00 but can add more if we need to. MICHAEL DIX GOES TO PRISON

C8s can be spotted almost anywhere these days; long gone are the days of "First C8 seen in Ohio" and other such rare sightings. Still, this is probably the first C8 to do parade laps in a prison yard. Though photos inside are, of course, not allowed, the picture below shows a very dusty 2020 Corvette that just finished the morning with several hundred inmates in Corcoran prison outside of Fresno.


Planning for this event began long ago, and was successful only though the help of the Bill Glass Behind the Walls prison ministry, who coordinated entry for the Corvette and 3 motorcycles seen here with the car. After an extremely thorough examination of both vehicles and drivers, we were led through a series of gates and alleys to one of 4 prison yards where 2 – 300 inmates were enjoying a couple hours of sunshine. Officers pointed to the far end of the yard, then made a circling motion with their hands to signal we could do parade laps around the partially paved yard. We were told to make all the noise we wanted, but no burn-outs and no wheelies. After opening up the exhaust (track setting) and backing up to the concrete dorm walls, it was determined the only way the 'Vette could make as much noise as the Harleys was to set it on fire and blow it up. A couple of the inmates offered to make that happen, but the group decision was to just remove the top and put the car on display on the basketball court.

This whole ordeal was repeated a couple hours later in "Charlie" yard, another section of the prison, and in both yards was a HUGE draw. The

prison has a very high ratio of men serving life sentences, so this was likely the only modern Corvette many of them would ever see. All of the inmates were very respectful, and crowded closely around the car but never actually touched it. Maybe all car shows should be surrounded by gun-toting guards in towers!

Will it ever happen again? We'll see.


