

## UPCOMING EVENT LIONS DRAG STRIP MUSEUM SEPTEMBER 16







The Lions Automobilia Foundation and Museum was founded in December 2019 by Southern California businessman and car enthusiast, Rick Lorenzen. It's nearly 100,000 sq. ft. facility includes galleries featuring Southern California's infamous car culture and motorsports history. The experience begins as visitors walk in thru a 1960's speed shop with genuine parts hanging off the walls and then enter the Main Street Gallery lined with classics automobiles parked in front of a 1950's diner. The visitor experience has been described as mind-blowing, as each gallery reveals the human experience with the automobile. Lions is more then just a museum. The Lions Automobilia Foundation takes preserving automotive history to the next level with its onsite restoration facility. As visitors walk through the galleries, they will find that many of the vehicles on display were restored by the Lions Team.

Steven Bronston is hosting this event. We have pre-purchased 25 tickets to get the reduced rate of \$11.00 but can add more if we need to. 

Taking Better photos of your car is very easy and rewarding.

We all love our Corvettes and with the cell phone we all carry we can take really great photos. The cameras in our phones are very, very, good and with the built-in software, the results can be surprising.

So here are couple of tips:

- 1. Clean your Camera Lens
- 2. Whenever possible, have the sun behind you.
- 3. Look Closely at the Background for things that do not Look Good
- 4. Turn your park lights on
- 5. Turn your 4 Way flashers
- 6. Roll your windows down
- 7. Put your sun visors up (both)
- 8. If you are taking a picture from the  $\frac{3}{4}$  Driver side turn your wheels slightly to the right
- 9. Get down on one knee to take the pictures, a lower perspective changes everything.

## **Top Story**

## **PreRun5**

The Southwest Organizing Team has moved the Caravan's third overnight stop on Saturday, August 24, 2024 from Grand Junction, Colorado to Glenwood Springs CO. This change was made after a planned, two-hour side trip to Arches National Park in the afternoon of Day Three proved impossible to arrange. Section Captain Bill Herold's decision to move the overnight stop 90 miles farther east will shorten the drive on Day Four by two hours.

The 2024 Caravan will be the first time the Southwest Section visits Glenwood Springs. With any new location for an overnight stop, the Southwest Organizing Team does at least one and often two prerun trips to survey hotel properties, assess food service, checkout entertainment and find a suitable location to stage the Caravan prior to the next morning's departure.



PreRun5's first stop was the high desert metropolis of Neenach for restrooms and munchies. Neenach is on SR138, 15 miles east of I-5. If you're east on 138 and you blink. You'll miss it. Image eNews Staff.

PreRun5 was a five-day trip over May 4-8 to Glenwood Springs. Family obligations prevented Section Captain Bill Herold from making the trip. The Team's six Caravan Commanders, Tony Megowan, Paula Megowan, Doug Campbell, Loretta Campbell, Lawrence Pittman and Hib Halverson visited Glenwood Springs. Sandy Halverson served as eNews Staff Photographer and Rosemary Pitman was along to keep everyone on good behavior. Fortunately, she was successful.

The PreRun5's four Corvettes left Ventura on 4MAY and drove to Cedar City Utah. The next day, they followed the Caravan's 2024 route from Cedar City, north on Interstate 15 and then east on I-70 to Glenwood Springs.

Glenwood Springs is a scenic, historic, resort town located at the confluence of the Colorado and Roaring Fork Rivers. It is most famous for the Glenwood Hot Springs Pool and the Iron Mountain Hot Springs. Rich with history and culture, Glenwood Springs has a vibrant dining scene, lots of boutique shopping, scenic golf courses, a variety of outdoor activities available, and is a great town for the Caravan's "Overnight3".

Old West history buffs frequent Glenwood Springs because the graves of Doc Holiday and Kid Curry are in its Linwood Cemetery. There is an entire page on the Visit Glenwood website about Doc Holiday who suffered from tuberculosis and spent his last days in Glenwood Springs.

The first PreRun5 activity took place Friday afternoon, May 5. Caravan XO Hib Halverson and Commander Tony Megowan had a meetand-greet with Chief Joseph Deras of the Glenwood Springs Police Department. They put the Chief's mind at ease about having 250 Corvettes driving the streets of his city on a Saturday night. They also discussed the PD's availability for traffic

control on Sunday, August 25, 2024 to expedite the Caravan's drive from the staging location in the west part of town to eastbound Interstate 70 onramp.

The following morning, the PreRun5 group had breakfast with Lisa Langer the Director of Tourism for "Visit Glenwood Springs" which is part of the Glenwood Springs Chamber Resort Association.

The Organizing Team received a list of hotel properties supplied by Visit Glenwood Springs. The Campbells and Lawrence Pittman visited several hotel properties that could meet the Caravan's needs and met with their management. The Halversons and the Megowans, and later joined by Cmd. Pitman visited three prospective locations at which to stage the Caravan for departure on the morning of the Day Four of the trip. Glenwood Springs has two shopping malls and a community center, each with parking lots of adequate size for Caravan staging. XO Halverson has picked one of the three locations and will be working to arrange its use for the Caravan.

Another reason we moved Overnight3 to Glenwood Springs is that it's the gateway to scenic Glenwood Canyon. We'll drive I-70 through the Canyon first thing in the morning of our fourth day on the road and that will make for a great way to begin the most scenic day of the trip.

Construction of I-70 in the Canyon began in 1980 and was completed in 1992. The 12.5-miles that runs though Glenwood Canyon. was the last part of the "Dwight D. Eisenhower National System of Interstate and Defense Highways," aka "the Interstate Highway System," to be built and it was the most expensive—in today's money it cost \$75,000,000 per mile or just under \$1,000,000,000...that's billion with a "b".

## **Primary Lead Car**

In early June, Section Captain Bill Herold and his Wife Viola picked up their Elkhart Lake Blue Metallic, 2023 Z06 Hardtop Convertible in a National Corvette Museum Delivery. The Herold's '23 C8 will be the Primary Lead Car for the Southwest Section of the 2024 National Corvette Caravan. Mike Furman at Chrisswell Chevrolet in Gaithersburg Maryland sold the car to the Herolds at MSRP. Crisswell is one of the rare Chevy stores selling Z06es at MSRP...like all Chevrolet dealers should be doing, we might add!

After a Museum Delivery some new owners ship their cars home, but not the Herolds. The Corvette True Believers they are, Bill and Vi broke-in their C8 Z06 with a six-day adventure back to California. Zigzagging their way across the midwest and southwest they visited relatives in St. Louis MO, Lincoln NB, Denver CO and Prescott AZ on their 2860-mile, cross-country, shake-down trip.

Upon return the first thing Captain Herold did was take the car to eNews sponsor Ghost Shield Film to have paint protection film (PPF) applied to the front end, the front of the mirrors and the rocker panels. ## The Return of the Blankee Benefit

Starting with the 2014 Caravan, the Southwest Caravan Organizing Team has commissioned commemorative "stadium blankets" displaying the Southwest Corvette Caravan logo and some text. For the 2014 and 2019 Caravans, when a Southwest Caravaner made a donation of a certain amount, that person received a Southwest Caravan Stadium Blanket.

At an Organizing Team meeting on 28June, Section Captain Bill Herold, who has been researching 2024 blankets for several months, showed a prototype of a '24 stadium blanket and directed the Team to reestablish the popular "Blankee Benefit" program for the 2024 Caravan.

For the 2024 Blanket, the Southwest Organizing Team has switched vendors to Integrated Impres-

sions of Laguna Nigel. Our Stadium Blankets will be 50 by 60 inches. They are fur lined with the logo and text applied by dye sublimation. They have no border with graphics and text being "full bleed".

The Organizing Team is rolling the "Blankee Benefit" into the existing "Caravan Patron Program." A Caravaners "ticket" into the Blankee Benefit is a minimum \$100.00 donation. Any Southwest Caravaner who donates \$100 or more becomes a "Caravan Patron" and gets a Southwest Corvette Caravan Stadium Blanket. All existing Caravan Patrons will receive blankets once we receive them from the supplying vendor.

## **Caravan Registration Information.**

In eNews7 we advised Southwest Corvette Caravaners to register early. So far, many Caravaners have done just that. Southwest Section CFO, Commander Paula Megowan, told the eNews just before deadline, Section CFO Paula Megowan told the eNews that 44 cars are registered for the Southwest Section of the National Caravan.

"My tenure on the Southwest Caravan Organizing Team goes back to 2002," Section XO Hib Halverson told the eNews. "For the four Caravans I've worked on previously, we never had any idea of the response until the Caravan's national registration opened two months before the Caravan began. That we already have 44 cars confirmed for the Caravan 14 months before we leave is amazing. Right now, the Organizing Team is a bit strapped for cash so, on behalf of Captain Herold and the rest of the Team, thanks to all who have registered early!"

As announced in eNews6, the SW Caravan costs \$100. Going to fee-based registration was a difficult decision for the Caravan Organizing Team because the previous SW Caravans did not charge a fee. Both the 2014 and 2019 Southwest Caravans lost money. Since the National Corvette Museum does not financially backstop any of Caravan Section, Section Captains take all the financial risk. The Section Captains for 2014 and 2019 both paid significant financial shortfalls after the two events concluded.

One of Captain Bill Herold's first policy decisions for the 2024 Caravan was the Section was going to charge per car. At an Organizing Team Meeting in mid-January, the fee was set at \$100.00.

Registration is accomplished the "old-fashioned" way. SW Caravaners will complete a Registration Form and mail that and a check for \$100 to Commander Paula Megowan, the Section's CFO.

At the end of this issue of eNews is a fillable .pdf into which you can enter data using your computer, tablet, or smartphone. Then will print the last page of this eNews then mail the finished form with your check to Paula Megowan who will email you back a confirmation.

Remember, the \$100 Southwest Registration Fee is in addition to the Corvette Museum's fee for the National Caravan. While NCM has yet to announce the fee, Section Captain Bill Herold has said that he anticipates it will be between \$35 and \$50.




