RECIPE OF THE MONTH

BOAT-CAKES:

Makes 12 semi-sweet oat-cakes in regular Muffin pans

Ingredients:

3 cups of large-flake oats (not instant)
3/4 cup of unsweetened shredded coconut (hemp hearts work too, or pecans, or...) I have hemp hearts, pecans and walnuts in this mixture.
3/4 cup of whole-wheat flour
1/4 + 1/8 cup of brown sugar
1 1/2 teaspoon of salt
1 1/4 teaspoon of baking soda

1 cup of warm water (or milk) I use milk
3/4 cup of yogurt
1/3 cup of vegetable oil

Preparation:

- Combine and mix all ingredients in a large bowl and let stand for 3 hours, covered
- Fill muffin pans with batter. I spray the bottom of the pan for easier removal after baking.
- Bake at 375°F for 30min 22-25 minutes in convection oven (for moist cakes).
- Remove from oven and let cool.

Notes:

-They freeze well.

-kids seem to like them.

-Best heated in the microwave for 20 seconds with a little maple-syrup, some swear by a little butter too.

CORVETTE TECH TIP Submitted by Richard Sheff

Greetings, OC Vettes!



Conda requested submissions for the club newsletter; so here I am, doing my part. Fair warning! If all goes well — and I receive no death threats — you'll see more of my relevant C8 content in the newsletters that follow. My objective for the run: give you some ideas to enhance your C8's appearance, safety and performance.

Most Corvette enthusiasts I know love driving their cars; but never seem content just leaving their rides, "as is." They are driven to make their version of "America's Sports Car" a little less factory and a lot more their own.

Modifying a Corvette yourself, and I've owned 3, can be daunting, expensive or both. So far, I've been successful controlling the cost involved to make my cookie-cutter Vette into something more unique. Bonafides aside, what I hope to share over the next few months are some subtle changes that maintain your Vette's integrity, are wallet friendly and add a little personality and performance to your factory build. Your journey begins with two upgrades that are ridiculously affordable and easy to complete.

Starting at the front end of your Stingray, locate the decorative plastic cover that resides just below the hood. This cover is designed to hide that area of the car where the State of California requires you to mount your license plate. If you want ugly, remove the cover and attach your front license plate here. If you're keen on maintaining the Vette's aesthetic, remove the cover, tape off the area around the word "CORVETTE," and spray paint it your color of choice. The cover easily snaps off with a plastic pry tool. Fortunately, the word "Corvette" is deeply recessed into the plastic cover. This will help make your result look satisfyingly professional and as good as anything done in Bowling Green. Be sure to clean off any over-spray before the paint thoroughly dries. I found using a soft rag moistened with acetone (C3H6O) works well and will not damage the finish. Cost: about \$5 for a can of paint. Hopefully, these images will help you see what's been described.





I love this next mod and you will too. Just to the left of your VIN, you'll find the words, "Team Corvette," etched in the windshield. I highlighted this somewhat obscure, factory "Easter egg" red, to match my interior. Choose any color you like to make your etching pop. The result is inexpensive, easy to complete and looks really cool. Here's how to do yours... Buy a sheet of colored vinyl paper at Hobby Lobby or Michaels. Cut it to size. About 2"x 4" should work. Color side facing forward, squeeze the 2"x4' sheet between the dash and windshield behind the etched, "Team Corvette." I used the eraser-end of a pencil to get the job done. Cost: about \$1 USD. Need help with this mod?

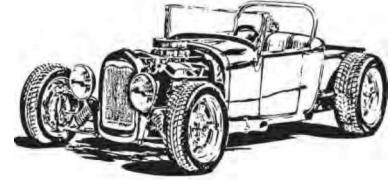
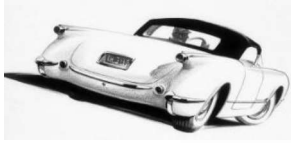
