IRISH SODA BREAD




Ingredients

- 3 cups all-purpose flour
- 2/3 cup sugar
- 3 teaspoons baking powder
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1 teaspoon baking soda

- 1 cup raisins
- 2 large eggs, room temperature, beaten
- 1-1/2 cups buttermilk
- 1 tablespoon canola oil

Preheat oven to 350°. In a large bowl, combine first five ingredients. Stir in raisins. Set aside 1 tablespoon beaten egg. In a bowl, combine buttermilk, oil and remaining eggs; stir into flour mixture just until moistened (dough will be sticky). Transfer to a greased 9-in. round baking pan; brush top with reserved egg. Bake 45-50 minutes or until a toothpick inserted in the center comes out clean. Cool 10 minutes before removing from pan to a wire rack to cool. Cut into wedges.

Ingredients

- 1 cup vanilla ice cream, softened if necessary
- 2 cups Guinness or other stout beer
- 2 tablespoons chocolate syrup

Divide ice cream between 2 glasses. Slowly top with beer. Drizzle with chocolate syrup. Serve immediately.

CORVETTE TECH TIPS Submitted by Richard Sheff



Greetings, OC Vettes!

Buckle up. It's time for another tip to make your C 8 great again. What follows is an excellent design mod I love and you will too.

This month's feature is a much needed appearance enhancement for the stern of your mid-engine marvel (Stingray or Z06) — arguably, the area most in need of an aesthetic upgrade. This mod's so good, I think even Kirk Bennion, Corvette's exterior design chief, would approve.

Personal disclosure. As a self-confessed "Vettehead" and C 8 owner, I am an addict. I am compelled to find ways to wake-up my Gen 8's formidable OEM performance and improve upon its already stunning, good looks. Most admirers, those who are not enthusiasts, are confused by my obsession. They consider the latest version of "America's Sports Car" to be a performance beast and automotive design perfection. My reality. There's no such thing as perfection. And that's the reality shared by many other lucky Gen 8 Corvette owners, as well.

Controlling this powerful urge can be tricky. If you want to avoid "pimping your ride" or turning your C 8 into an expensive, "Big Daddy Roth" cartoon, I'm here to help. As a reminder: I use every product featured. I have no

financial interest in any of the companies recommended, and I dig mods that are effective, subtle, inexpensive and chrome.



When I first saw it; I had to have it. It's that good.

The C 8's rear license plate cover was designed to fit multiple domestic and foreign plate sizes. The story behind its odd, 6 sided shape though, remains a mystery. Problem is, this area is much too large for American license plates. For me, that makes the empty space that surrounds the license plate look unfinished. That bothered me. It bothered me a lot. Thankfully, I found the perfect fix for GM's design blunder. It's beautifully executed, inexpensive and simple to install.

My solution: The Etesan license plate holder, available on Amazon for \$159. Their unit is a: 2 layer, 3 dimensional rear bezel that beautifully fills that empty space your rear license plate now calls home. The bezel fits the entire plate area perfectly, matches the the OEM bumper grills flanking it, is all aluminum, comes painted black and includes a carbon fiber back plate. It's also ridiculously easy to install and the back plate gives you 2 "mout" (sic) or appearance options. Etesan's package is extraordinarily complete. All the necessary hardware and tools are included to make installation quick, secure and easy.

Congratulations on your newly enhanced C 8. It's beautiful and it's fast. Time to give all your mid-engine mods a road test. Take these 5 critical steps — in the order in which they appear — to give your freshly modded mid-engine monster a proper road test. Start the process by initiating the "hood's" version of an "Italian tune-up" and "drive it like you stole it." Return your ride to your garage. Let it cool down. Give it a final,

admiring look; then go have a beer. Not a Bud Lite. A real beer. After all, isn't that what being part of the Corvette community's all about? That, my Corvette colleagues, is how we roll.

One final thought before I go. Who among you has actually installed any of the mods I've suggested? If you have not, and you think I'm an idiot for wasting space in the club's newsletter every month, let me know. I won't hit you. I'd just like a little feedback; that's all.


