K1 GO KART RACING EVENT

MAY 18

Hosted by Tony Siragusa



The event will be held at the K1 Circuit Race Trace, 32240 Grand Avenue, Winchester.

The cost per racer is \$150. for the 3-race package. There are no additional charges for visitors and guests. Note, racing is still conducted in the rain. Men and women are encouraged to participate in racing. If we have enough ladies we may be able to schedule a ladies only category.

The Package will include:

3-10 minute race events beginning at about 12:15pm. 1st is a practice run, 2nd is qualifications, and 3rd the main race. It will feature a grid start based on previous lap times. There will be approximately 20-30 minutes between races. The top three finishers will receive trophies on the podium.

1. All drivers will check in and receive wrist bands.
2. Briefing: Once checked in all drivers will attend a brief session, including a short video on how to operate the karts and an introduction to the track.
3. Suit & Helmet Sizing: Included are Racing suits. You will be given gloves and a head cover (head sock) for use under your helmet to keep.
4. Introduction to your electric Kart.

FOOD:

I have scheduled the race time so if we eat, it will not be until after we race. This will reduce/prevent possible discomfort while racing. The track informed me that we cannot bring in our own food. Possibly we can bring our own drinks.

The track offers two catering options, NOT INCLUDED IN THE RACE PACKAGE. We will make a decision based upon your replies.

RECIPE OF THE MONTH NO. 1
CINNAMON ROLL CAKE

Ingredients:

3 cups flour
1/4 tsp. salt
1 cup sugar
4 tsp. baking powder

1 1/2 cups milk
2 eggs
2 tsp. vanilla
1/2 cup butter melted

- TOPPING -

1 cup butter softened
1 cup brown sugar

2 Tbsp. flour
1 Tbsp. cinnamon

- GLAZE -

2 cups powdered sugar
5 Tbsp. milk

1 tsp. vanilla

Instructions

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Spray a 9×13 glass baking pan with cooking spray. Set aside.

FOR CAKE: In an electric or stand mixer add the flour, salt, sugar, baking powder, milk, eggs, and vanilla. Once combined well, slowly stir in the melted butter. Pour into the prepared 9×13 baking pan.

FOR TOPPING: In a large bowl mix the 2 sticks of butter, brown sugar, flour and cinnamon together until well combined and creamy. Drop evenly over the batter by the tablespoonfuls and use a knife to marble/swirl through the cake. Bake at 350 for 35-40 minutes or when a toothpick inserted near the center comes out nearly clean.

FOR GLAZE: In a medium bowl, mix the powdered sugar, milk and vanilla together with a whisk. Drizzle evenly over the warm cake. Serve warm or at room temperature.

RECIPE OF THE MONTH NO. 2

CARROT CAKE

- **2 cups Sugar**
- **2 cups Flour (self rising)**
- **2 teaspoons Cinnamon**
- **4 eggs (beaten)**
- **1 can (8oz) crushed Pineapple with juice**

- 1 ½ cup Oil (your choice)
- 2 teaspoons Vanilla
- 1 teaspoon Salt
- 1 cup Coconut
- 2 cup shredded Carrots
- 1 cup Nuts (walnuts or pecans)

Preheat the oven to 350 degrees F. Grease and flour three 8-inch round cake pans.

Beat eggs in a large bowl. Gradually beat in sugar, oil, and vanilla. Stir in pineapple.

Combine flour, cinnamon, and salt in a separate bowl, then stir into egg mixture until absorbed.

Stir in carrots, coconut and nuts. Pour evenly into the prepared cake pans.

Bake until a toothpick inserted into the center of the cake comes out clean, 45 to 50 minutes. Cool, add cream cheese frosting

INTERESTING FACT(S)

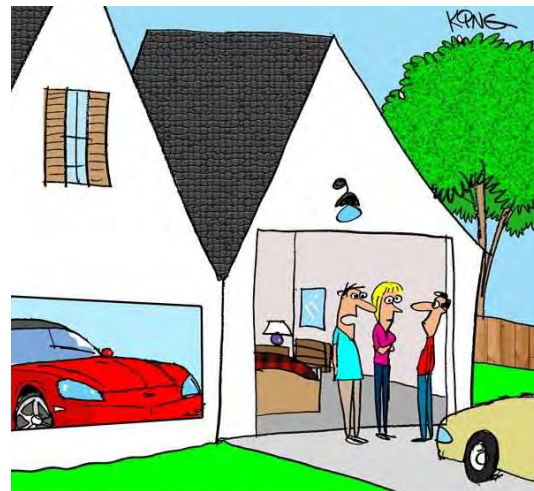
THE FIRST PERSON CONVICTED OF SPEEDING WAS GOING EIGHT MPH
