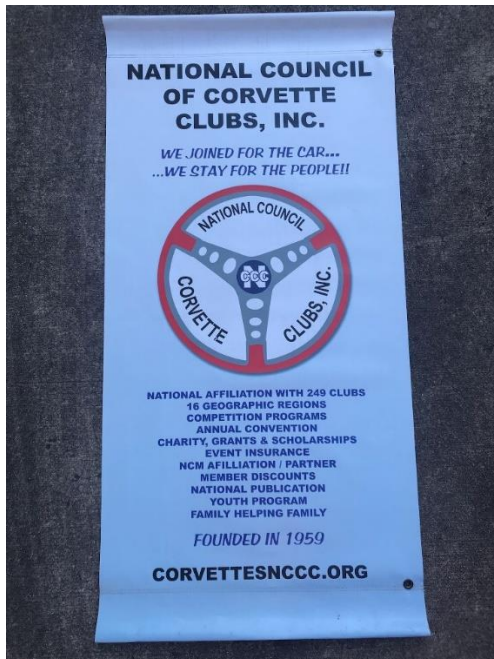

2026 NCCC PROPOSED RULEBOOK CHANGES

Dear NCCC Members, the time has come for the new 2026 Competition Rulebook proposed Rule Changes. We are now doing this on an annual basis instead of every two years. Please take the time to review the proposed changes and let your Club Governor know how you want to vote. The Governors will then cast their votes via our electronic ballot voting system which will be available soon. While most are simple Rule Change requests, there are several more detailed proposed Chapter Updating and Supplemental Programs targeting our youngest members to encourage them and promote their participation in our organization. Please help us nudge NCCC into a new era of Competition and prospective membership growth.

Proposed Rules are in Chapter format numerical sequence.

A more detailed description of each Proposed Rule Change and all seven Sub-Committee Proposal Final Version documents are on our [NCCC Website under Competition Current Clarifications and Proposed Rule Changes](#).

The following is an ultra-brief and simple explanation of each Proposed Rule Change.

CHAPTER 1. GENERAL INFORMATION

1: Rule Change 2024-R9:

VP of Comp note: Proposed 100 mile minimum between events in lieu of the current 150 mile minimum.

2: Rule Change 2024-R18:

VP of Comp note: Adding B. Statement following 1.4.5.A.

1.4.5.B. Two (2) or more clubs may host separate events on the same day at the same location.

CHAPTER 2. SPEED EVENTS

3: Rule Change 2024-R14:

VP of Comp note: This makes it Mandatory to provide Parade Laps at Speed Events unless waived by majority of participants at the Driver's Meeting.

4: Rule Change 2025-R17:

VP of Comp note: Add statement recommending Transponders to time High Speed and Time Trials. Also adding that cell phones qualify as a form of timing.

5: Rule Change 2025-R15:

VP of Comp note: Allow any steering wheel and removable steering wheels in Groups 2 and 3.

6: Rule Change 2024-R15:

VP of Comp note: Updating to current safety Roll Bar Requirements.

7: Rule Change 2024-R13:

VP of Comp note: Add Venue dB Noise Level Restriction Requirements.

8: Rule Change 2024-R11:

VP of Comp note: SPEED EVENT RE-CLASSIFICATION from current Alphabet Classes to Corvette Generation Classes, Class Tables, Group and Sub-Group FTD Tables and Points Matrix updated. Current 2.7 Group and Class Matrix Regulations remain as is.

CHAPTER 3. DRAG RACES

9: Rule Change 2025-R12:

VP of Comp note: DRAG RACES CHAPTER UPDATING PROPOSAL: Chapter 3: Drag Events: Update multiple items throughout the Drag Chapter, mostly adding Post Technical Inspection Procedures, provide solutions for C7, C8 and future Corvette Generations to improve their participation, Re-establishing of Drag Records and Drags Re-Classification to align with the Speed events Re-Classification, upgrading NCCC participant Points with a new Drag Event Points Matrix per the Competition Drag Updating Proposal.

CHAPTER 8. CHAMPIONSHIP POINTS

10: Rule Change 2025-R2:

VP of Comp note: Add NCCC Youth and FCOA Members as Potential Competition Points Recipients

11: Rule Change 2025-R13:

VP of Comp note: Recognize Top 3 Youth Members in our National Points Standings, must accumulate at least 500 points.

CHAPTER 11. TIME TRIALS

12: Rule Change 2025-R4 through 2025-R9:
